

ABOUT THE RESEARCH FORUM

The Southeast Michigan Center for Medical Education and its member hospitals are pleased to present the 43rd Annual SEMCME Research Forum. In addition to their academic and clinical responsibilities, residents in graduate medical education programs participate in research activities. The Forum was established in 1978 to recognize the research efforts of the residents from our member hospitals and to recognize their scholarly achievements.

This year the format has been revised to an online format that will allow for over thirty recorded voice over Powerpoint presentations (VOPP) and approximately ten live slide powerpoint presentations (LSPP) presented on May 26th. The more than 40 papers will represent the best research efforts made by SEMCME residents. All will be selected from clinic day competition at the following SEMCME member institutions:

The residents' research will be judged on originality, quality of research, and effectiveness of presentation. Over \$2,000 in cash prizes and awards will be presented at the awards ceremony immediately following the live slide competition on May 26.

DAVID R. PIEPER SEMCME RESEARCH AWARD

The first place winner in the LSPP competition will receive the David R. Pieper, PhD SEMCME Research Award. This Award, in the form of a handsome silver medallion, will honor the many outstanding contributions made by Dr. Pieper – researcher, faculty educator, mentor, and longtime Executive Director of SEMCME. Dr. Pieper's exceptional dedication and leadership spans the continuum of medical education – undergraduate, graduate, and continuing medical education and in so doing, he has greatly advanced the field of medical education in Michigan and beyond.



DAWSON AWARD

The Dawson Award, also in the form of a silver medallion, will be presented to the first place winner in this year's VOPP competition. For over 40 years, this coveted Award has recognized the many contributions made by Donald Dawson, MD, a dynamic surgeon and medical researcher involved in early discussions of "cutting edge" medical education consortia in SE Michigan.
