FEATURED ACGME FACULTY



Mary Lieh-Lai, MD, FAAP, FCCP - Senior Vice President, Medical Accreditation

Dr. Lieh-Lai is the Senior Vice President for Medical Accreditation at the ACGME, Professor of Pediatrics (voluntary) at Wayne State University School of Medicine and Senior Scholar in the Department of Education, University of Illinois School of Medicine. Her training and former clinical practice was in Pediatric Critical Care Medicine. She was a Program Director for 12 years and a Designated Institutional Official for the Children's Hospital of Michigan for 7 years. She was a member of and served as Vice Chair of the ACGME Pediatrics Review Committee. In addition, Dr. Lieh-Lai served on the American Academy of Pediatrics Editorial Board of the Pediatrics Review Preparation (PREP-ICU), the National Board of Medical Examiners USMLE Step 2 Pediatrics Committee, and the American Board of Pediatrics sub-board of Critical Care Medicine.



Louis J. Ling, MD - Senior Vice President, Hospital-Based Accreditation

Dr. Ling is the Senior Vice President for Hospital-Based Accreditation at the ACGME. Previously, he was Associate Dean for Graduate Medical Education at the University of Minnesota (UM), and concurrently, Chief Medical Education Officer at Hennepin County Medical Center (HCMC) in Minneapolis. He practiced at HCMC for 30 years, where he also directed the Emergency Medicine, Medical Toxicology, and Transitional Year residency programs. He was the Medical Director of the Hennepin Regional Poison Center for 18 years. As Professor of Emergency Medicine and Director of the Section of Emergency Medicine, he formed the new academic Department of Emergency Medicine at UM. Dr. Ling was a resident member, member, and chair of the ACGME Review Committee for Emergency Medicine, and a member of the first Institutional Review Committee. He was also on the ACGME Board of Directors, where he served on the Committee on Requirements, Monitoring Committee, Policy Committee, and the Governance Committee. As one of the first medical toxicologists in the country, he published in that field, and was an editor of three toxicology textbooks. He was also an editor of five editions of Rosen's Emergency Medicine and two editions of Harwood-Nuss' Clinical Emergency Medicine.



John R. Potts III, MD - Senior Vice President, Surgical Accreditation

Dr. Potts is Senior Vice President for Surgical Accreditation at the ACGME. He is also an Adjunct Professor of Surgery at the University of Texas Houston Medical School (UTHMS). Dr. Potts received a BA with Honors in History from Oklahoma State University. He graduated from medical school at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, where he also completed his surgery residency. He did fellowships in Surgical Gastroenterology at the University of Utah under the direction of Dr. Frank Moody, and in Portal Hypertension at Emory University under the direction of Dr. Dean Warren. Dr. Potts was Program Director in Surgery at the UT Houston for 21 years, and Vice-Chair for Education there for 17 years. He served as chair of the UTMSH GMEC for 16 years, and for 10 years served as Assistant Dean for GME and Designated Institutional Official. Dr. Potts has served for over a decade on the faculty of the American College of Surgeons (ACS) Surgical Education Principles and Practices course. He served on the design team and the faculty of the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) Group on Resident Affairs inaugural GME Leadership Development Course, and initiated the Association of Program Directors in Surgery (APDS) New Program Director Workshop in 2001, for which he is a faculty member. He has also served as chair of the GME Committee of the Southwestern Surgical Congress.

Dr. Carl Christensen obtained his Medical degree from Wayne State University School of Medicine and is board-certified in Obstetrics & Gynecology and Addiction Medicine. He most recently served as the Medical Director for both Dawn Farm Treatment Center and Spera Detox Center and has received over the years recognition from *Hour Magazine* as a “Top Doc” in Addiction Medicine.

Heidi Kromrei, PhD

Dr. Kromrei is Assistant Dean of Learning and Teaching in the Wayne State University School of Medicine Office of Medical Education and Adjunct Associate Professor of Ophthalmology, Visual and Anatomical Sciences. Dr. Kromrei previously served as the Associate Designated Institutional Official, Director of Medical Education for Osteopathic Programs, and Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs at the Detroit Medical Center. She received her Doctor of Philosophy degree in Education from Wayne State University in the Department of Education, Division of Administration and Organizational Development. Her research interests include performance measurement and management in organizational systems, leadership development in medical education, program evaluation, and reducing evaluation biases.

John Watt, MD

Dr. Watt served as a Program Director for over 12 years in several different residencies (Med-Peds, Internal Medicine, and Transitional Year). He currently serves as the Director of Medical Education at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital Ann Arbor & Livingston. He is very passionate about medical education and developing new physician leaders.

Dr. Weinberger is Assistant Professor and Program Director, Department of Internal Medicine at Wayne State University School of Medicine.
