



## Organizational Timeline

### 1970's

- ❖ 1973 - Oakland Health Education Program (OHEP) was founded with six-member hospitals (Crittenton Hospital, Pontiac General Hospital, Pontiac Osteopathic Hospital, Providence Hospital, St. Joseph Mercy Oakland, and William Beaumont Hospital) and three universities (Oakland University, University of Michigan, and Wayne State University)
- ❖ 1974 - Oakland Health Education is formally incorporated
- ❖ 1976 - Offices established at Varner House on Oakland University Campus in Rochester
- ❖ 1978 - Dr. William Carter announces the first results of the use of Interferon in tumor reduction at the OHEP Meadow Brook Lecture Series in Medicine and Surgery

### 1980's

- ❖ 1981 - Dr. Michael DeBakey reports on the long-term results of 10,000 coronary artery bypass grafts at the Annual Meadow Brook Lecture Series in Medicine and Surgery
- ❖ 1983 - New membership categories added: Program, Associate, Full / Crittenton and Beaumont Hospitals withdrew from Full Membership
- ❖ 1984 - St. John Hospital joined as Program Member and Mt Carmel Mercy joined as Associate Member / Dr. William DeVries reports on the first human implantation of a mechanical heart at the Annual Meadow Brook Lecture Series in Medicine and Surgery
- ❖ 1986 - Mt. Carmel Mercy Hospital joined as Full Member / Dr. Anthony Fauci gives update on AIDS at the Annual Meadow Brook Lecture Series in Medicine and Surgery
- ❖ 1987 - Beaumont Hospital rejoined as Program Member for OB-GYN
- ❖ 1989 - St. John Hospital joined as Associate Member for Internal Medicine and Surgery and Oakwood Hospital joined as Program Member for Internal Medicine

### 1990's

- ❖ 1990 - Grace Hospital acquired Mt. Carmel Mercy Hospital and became a Full Member/ Beaumont Hospital became an Associate Member for OB-GYN and Family Medicine/ Bon Secours Hospital joined as Program Member for Internal Medicine/ Name changed to OHEP Center for Medical Education/ Offices moved to Civic Center Drive, Southfield/ WSUSOM, DMC, and OHEP Center for Medical Education signed major affiliation agreements in Internal Medicine and Continuing Medical Education

- ❖ 1991 - Board of Directors Retreat at St. Clair Inn/ St. John Hospital joined as Full Member
- ❖ 1992 - Sinai Hospital joined as Program Member for Surgery
- ❖ 1993 - Beaumont Hospital withdrew membership/ Sinai Hospital joined as Associate Member for Surgery and Family Medicine/ Bon Secour Hospital upgraded to Associate Member for Internal Medicine and Family Medicine and DMC joined as Full Multi-hospital System Member
- ❖ 1994 - Beaumont Hospital rejoined as Program Member for OB-GYN
- ❖ 1996 - Henry Ford Hospital joined as Program Member for OB-GYN/ OHEP and WSUSOM signed an affiliation agreement in Surgery and established the WSU-OHEP Medical Education Consortium by signing the General Consortium Agreement / Dr. Lazar Greenfield looks back on the history of the Greenfield Filter in the management of Thrombo-embolic Disease at the Annual Meadow Brook Lecture Series
- ❖ 1997 - Corporate retreat at Edison Inn in Port Huron/ Save 100 Grant Funded Initiative: "Promoting physician quality, cost-effective choices through education."
- ❖ 1998 - Oakwood Hospital upgraded to Full Member
- ❖ 1999 - ACGME introduced six Core Competencies / Dr. Keith Campbell reflects on Cloning Dolly: Implications in Human Medicine and Biotechnology at the Annual Meadow Brook Lecture

## 2000's

- ❖ 2000 - Henry Ford Hospital upgraded to Full Member
- ❖ 2001 - Corporate Retreat at Orchard Lake Country Club/ Beaumont Hospital rejoins as Full Member/ First summer for OHEP Scholars Program
- ❖ 2002 - Ernest Hammel, PhD retired and Joseph Brocato, PhD became Executive Director
- ❖ 2003 - First Project Medical Education at Detroit Renaissance Center/ Significant Strategic Planning – Emphasis on GME and Faculty Development and decision to move away from CME and Undergraduate Medical Education
- ❖ 2004 - Sinai Hospital joins as Full Member / Dr. Andrew Simor reflects on SARS: What Have We Learned at the Annual Meadow Brook Lecture
- ❖ 2005 - SEMCME offices moved to 101 E. Alexandrine at Detroit Medical Center/ Name changed to Southeast Michigan Center for Medical Education (SEMCME)/ Second Project Medical Education takes place/ Dr. Joseph Brocato resigned and Dr. David Pieper took over as Executive Director
- ❖ 2006 - St. Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor joined as Full Member/ Simulation Symposium at MSU Troy Management Center

- ❖ 2007 - Crittenton Hospital rejoined as Program Member/ Project Medical Education takes place with Dr. Atul Grover/ Past President celebration takes place at Oakwood Hospital
- ❖ 2009 - Project Medical Education took place with Edward Salsberg

## 2010's

- ❖ 2010 – Corporate Retreat at Grosse Pointe War Memorial
- ❖ 2011 - OUWB School of Medicine launched first med class/ St. Mary Mercy joined as Associate Member
- ❖ 2012 - SEMCME offices moved to University Health Center
- ❖ 2013 - ACGME introduces Next Accreditation System
- ❖ 2015 - ACGME, the American Osteopathic Association (AOA), and the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM) agree to pursue a single, unified accreditation system for graduate medical education programs
- ❖ 2016 - First Program Director's Workshop/ First Michigan QI Summit / SEMCME added Anesthesiology, Pediatrics, and Transitional Year Committees
- ❖ 2017 - McLaren Health joined as Full Member
- ❖ 2018 - First Transition to Practice Workshop and added Wellness Committee/ Beaumont Hospital Farmington Hills joined as Program Member for Surgery
- ❖ 2019 - Dr. David Pieper retired and Ms. Kate Sheppard took over as new Executive Director

## 2020's

- ❖ 2020 - Pivoted educational programming to the virtual environment in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic/ Development of COVID-19 Hot Topic Series.
- ❖ 2021 - Dr. Michael Geheb took over as Executive Director and initiated the development and launch of the new strategic plan to refocus and guide the SEMCME organization/ Garden City Hospital joined as a Program Member in Surgery and St. Mary Mercy rejoined as Program Member in Internal Medicine/ Dr. Arnold Monto announced the Impact of COVID-19: Where We Stand at the Annual Meadow Brook Lecture
